International Human Rights Framework

- Right to social security
- Right to an adequate standard of living
- ▶ Right to non-discrimination between men and women
- ► ICESCR, CEDAW, ILO and other treaties
- Australia's obligations
- ► Treaty body reporting, individual complaints, UPR, UN Special Rapporteurs

Domestic Human Rights Framework

- ▶ No federal bill of rights
- State and territory human rights Acts no right to social security
- ► Human rights scrutiny legislation and the PJCHR
- ► Anti-discrimination law?
